



NO. It all depends on what I make of my life.



Her winning pitch? The creation of "ReadPublic", an online book price comparison platform aimed at spurring the reading habit among Malaysians.






SECURITY



FINANCIAL INDEPENDENCE IS THEIR #1 GOAL




FINANCIAL INDEPENDENCE IS PARAMOUNT FOR HAPPINESS. EARN AND BURN YOUR WAY!


IF IT'S A STRUGGLE.. IT'S WORTH IT






THEY EXPERIENCE A DEEP INTERNAL CONFLICT WHEN IT COMES TO RELIGION

My uztazah (religious teacher) in school told me that if I didn't wear a headscarf, evil spirits will put 'najis' on my head and I will be impure.


I did not like that my pastor said that wives should be submissive to their husband to be a 'noble' wife. I don't go to that church anymore.

RELIGION IS BIGGER THAN WHAT PEOPLE MAKE OF IT






I FEEL SOCIETY'S GRIP OF MASCULINITY LOOSENING




